

PREREGISTER TO SAVE TIME AND MONEY!

PREREGISTRATION IS EASY!

- Note when registering a dentist's staff that only dentists are ADA Members. There is no reduced pricing for a Member's staff.
- 3) Multiple people can be added to registration, sharing the same credit card. While in the initial person's account, look for the red button that says "Add Attendee" or the pull down menu subheading that says "Add registrant."

ONLINE HANDOUTS


CANCELLATION/ REFUND POLICY
